Many veterans of World War II. eligible for G. I. loans have until July 25, 1962 to take a lvan. tage of the G. I. Housing Program In some cases, World War I vet. erans entitlement will not opire until July 25, 1965, William A Donoghue, Director, Weste ster County Veterans' Service A ency stated today.

Eligible Korean veterans have until January 31, 1965 to expresse their entitlement to a Government guaranteed or insured load but again, some Korean veteral will have until January 31, 1975, to take advantage of this benefit Mr. Donoghue continued.

Both World War II and Is mean veterans who have existing G. I loans, but who would find i necessary to dispose of their present holdings and move elsewhere under certain conditions, can obtain a new loan, Director Donoghue further stated. Those who have any questions about the provisions of the G. I. loan program may obtain expert counseling and assistance at the local office of the Westchester County Veterans Service New Rochelle and Peekskill
