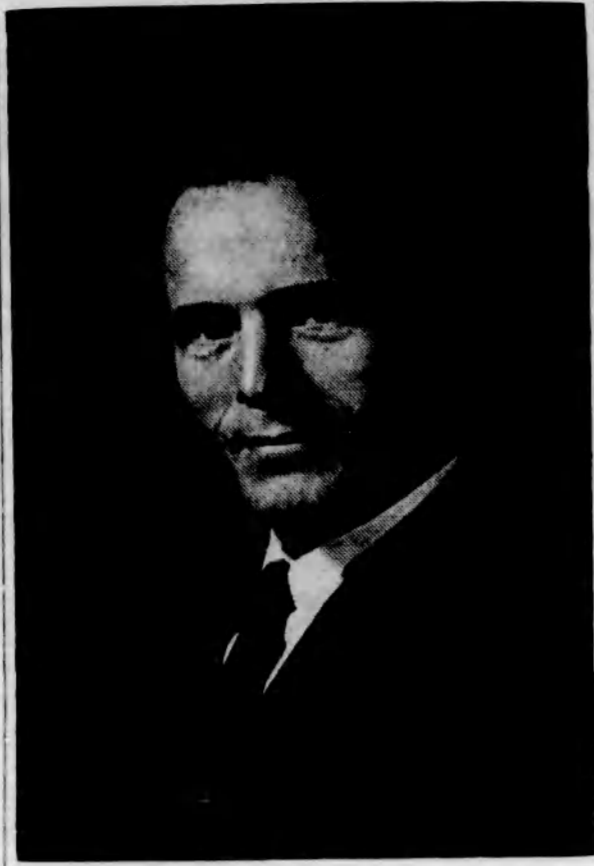

### Health Education Being Discussed By Combined PTOs

"Improved Health Education in Public School Education" will be the topic at the meeting of the combined Parent Teacher Organizations of all public and parochial schools in Rye on Wednesday, Jan. 25, at Midland School Auditorium. Coffee will be served at 7:45 and the program will begin at 8:15.

The principal speaker will be Dr. Robert Kaplan, associate professor of health education at Ohio State University. Dr. Kaplan is a national authority in this field and recently spent three years with the American Medical Association working in a national health survey.

Following Dr. Kaplan's talk there will be a discussion period with audience participation. A panel of five individuals has been planned to assist in this discussion. The panel will consist of: Miss Dorothy Tipple, R.N. M.S., Director of School Nurse-Teachers, New York State Department of Education; Rev.
