

WIDE VARIETY OF ACTIVITIES SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM

The Rye Recreation Commission today announced the main playground events, field trips, and movies to be conducted this summer as part of the day camp program.

Special Events On Playground
"Nature-Mobile", Thursday, July 5, 10 a.m.; Folk Singing, Friday, July 6, 1 p.m.; Puppet Making, Thursday, July 12, 1 p.m.; the Mount Kisco Children's Theatre presents an original musical, Tuesday, July 17, 10 a.m.; Brass Ensemble, Friday, July 20, 1:15 p.m. in the Midland School auditorium; Puppet Theater, Monday, July 23, 10 a.m.; Woodwind Ensemble, Friday, July 27, 1:15 p.m. in the Midland School Auditorium; Music on Playgrounds, Tuesday, July 31, 1 p.m.; Folk and Square Dancing, Wednesday, August 1, 11 a.m.

These special events are for the playground children and will be held in the rear of the Youth Recreation Center, 281 Midland Avenue, unless otherwise noted. They are provided as a public recreation service by the Westchester County Recreation Commission.

Special Events In Community
Special events for Rye residents to be conducted by the Recreation Commission this summer will be: A Square Dance on Tuesday, July 10, at 8:30 p.m., at the Multiple-use area behind 51 Milton Road.

The annual Outdoor Concert to be held at the Rye High School parking area on Sunday, July 22 at 8 p.m. will feature a concert orchestra and guest singer.

The annual Block Dance will be held on Wednesday August 15 at 8:30 p.m. at Parking Area #1 opposite the Rye Fire House, and will feature social and square dancing to the music of two bands.

These events will be conducted in cooperation with the local musician's unions and the Westchester County Recreation Commission. There will be no charge, and all Rye residents are invited.

Group Trips
This year eight group trips will be offered to the children in the playground program. They are:

Day Camping trips to Camp Senasqua on Croton Point will feature swimming, nature, pioneering, athletics, and a cookout and will leave at 8 a.m. on Tuesday, July 10, Tuesday, July 24, and Tuesday, August 7. These trips will be for the children in the

third, fourth, fifth and sixth grade groups.

On Tuesday, July 17, at 1 p.m., the children in the first and second grade groups will go to Kiddieland at Playland.

A trip to Yankee Stadium will be conducted on Thursday, July 26 for boys and girls ages 10 to 16.

A Bronx Zoo trip for the children in the first, second, third and fourth grade groups will be held on Thursday, August 2, leaving at 9 a.m.

Children in the third, fourth, fifth and sixth grade groups will go to Freedomland at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, August 14.

On Wednesday, August 15, the children in the first and second grade groups will take a tour of the Rye Police and Fire Departments, leaving at 1 p.m.

All trips will depart from the parking lot of the Youth Recreation Center, 281 Midland Avenue.

Movies
Again this year, a program of top flight movies will be offered to the playground children. They will be held at 2 p.m. every Friday from July 6 to August 17 in the auditorium of Midland School. In case of rain earlier in the week, the movie for that week will be included as part of the rainy day program and shown on that day at the same time and place.

The movies will be: "Three Worlds of Gulliver"—July 6; "One Thousand and One Arabian Nights"—July 13; "The Pied Piper of Hamelin"—July 20; "Five Thousand Fingers of Dr. T"—July 27; "Guns of Fort Petticoat"—August 3; "The Seventh Voyage of Sinbad"—August 10; "Outlaw Stallion"—August 17.

G.I. Loans Available to World War II Veterans

Many veterans of World War II, eligible for G. I. loans, have until July 25, 1962 to take advantage of the G. I. Housing Program. In some cases, World War II veterans entitlement will not expire until July 25, 1965. William A. Donoghue, Director, Westchester County Veterans' Service Agency stated today.

Eligible Korean veterans have until January 31, 1965 to exercise their entitlement to a Government guaranteed or insured loan, but again, some Korean veterans will have until January 31, 1975 to take advantage of this benefit. Mr. Donoghue continued.

Both World War II and Korean veterans who have existing G. I. loans, but who would find it necessary to dispose of their present holdings and move elsewhere under certain conditions, can obtain a new loan, Director Donoghue further stated. Those who have any questions about the provisions of the G. I. loan program may obtain expert counseling and assistance at the local office of the Westchester County Veterans Service Agency located at White Plains, New Rochelle and Peekskill.
