

Paul Harney Out To Settle Score With Palmer

Pro golfer Paul Harney has a score to settle with pro golf great Arnold Palmer.

Paul's out to avenge that costly sudden-death defeat he suffered at the hands of Palmer in the rich \$100,000 Thunderbird Classic Golf Tournament at Westchester Country Club last June in the current journey starting today.

That one-hole or one-shot setback cost Harney, a part-time tourist, a whopping \$15,000 — the difference between Palmer's first place check of \$25,000 and Harney's runner-up share of ten grand. The T-Bird rivals finished the 72-hole trek all even with identical four-round totals of 282 in last year's Thunderbird.

The record throngs which viewed the '63 classic will never forget that down-the-wire drive by both Harney and Palmer, particularly the momentary competitive lapses which struck both rivals at the 71st hole.

It was there at the short, par-4 71st hole where both Paul and Arnie took bogey fives that stunned the huge gallery both on the scene and on television.

Palmer sent his wedge shot soaring over the green, flubbed his third and still managed to come up with a fine bogey-5. Harney dumped his approach in the sand, and blasted out 10 feet for two putts and his bogey-5.

After halving the 72nd hole, the rivals stepped to the sudden-death target, a long par-3 test.

Palmer hit the green with his four iron. Harney hit the sand with his four-iron. And there went the \$15,000 for personable Paul.

"I sure would like to even that one up," said Harney in notifying tournament officials of his Thunderbird invitation acceptance. "That was a lot of dough to blow on one shot."

And Harney gets his chance to do just that right now at Westchester.
