Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Rye as follows: Section 1. Section 9-4.72 of the Building Zone Ordinance of the City of Rye is hereby amende by adding thereto the following paragraph (d):

(d) In locations subject to per odic or occasional flooding water from streams or brook no structure of any kind sha be erected or any filling undertaken in such a manne as to reduce or impede the rur off of flood waters to an exten that would increase the hazar of flood damage at these loca tions or elsewhere along said stream or brook.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon the publication thereof.
