## ALDO J. CORRADI

A solemn requiem mass was held this morning at the Church of the Resurrection for Aldo John Corradi, 58, who died Monday night at his home, 36 Palisade Road. Interment was in St. Mary's Cemetery.

A resident of Rye for 42 years, Mr. Corradi was born in Port Cersio, Italy, Dec. 16, 1911, son of the late Frank Corradi and Mrs. Louise Itanti Corradi of the home address. A 1934 graduate of Rye High School, he was an Army veteran of World War II. He was a waiter captain at the Westchester Country Club for 10 years, holding the post his father had before him for 25 years. He then worked for seven years as waiter captain at the Outpost Restaurant in Port Chester. At the time of his death, he was a gate man at the Milton Harbor House.

A member of the Church of the Resurrection and its Holy Name Society, he was also a member of the Port Chester Old Timers and Rye Post 128, American Legion.

In addition to his mother, he is survived by his wife, Ellen Melvin Corradi of the home address, a first grade teacher at Midland School; four children, Brother Francis Corradi, S.C. of Jackson Heights, N. Y., Mrs. Daniel Wells of Rye, Miss Agnes Corradi, a senior at Seton Hill College in Greensburg, Pa. and Miss Mary Louise Corradi, a sixth-grade student at Midland School.

 At a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Rye held in City Hall in said city on the 4th day of November, 1970, at 8:00 P.M. of said day, the following ordinance was adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of said Council present at said meeting and voting thereon:

**ORDINANCE NO. 9-1970**  
 Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Rye as follows:  
 Section 1. Section 9-4.72 of the Building Zone Ordinance of the City of Rye is hereby amended by adding thereto the following paragraph (d):

(d) In locations subject to periodic or occasional flooding by water from streams or brooks no structure of any kind shall be erected or any filling undertaken in such a manner as to reduce or impede the runoff of flood waters to an extent that would increase the hazard of flood damage at these locations or elsewhere along said stream or brook.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon the publication thereof.

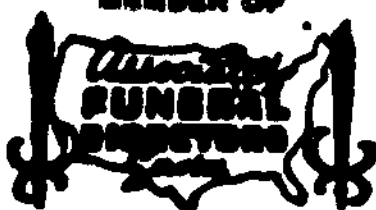
