JEAN CRAWFORD WINS APAWAMIS LADIES' **CHAMPIONSHIP**

Three-time member of the Women's Curtis Cup team which won over the British in 1962, 1966 and 1968, Mrs. Crawford, who (with her husband Charles) recently moved to New York City from her native Chanute, Kansas, was the United States Women's Amateur Champion in 1965 and twice was Runnerup for this title—in 1960 and 1967. Kansas State Women's Titleholder in 1955 and again in 1961, Jean also took her home club championship at the Chanute Country Club on many occasions.

Sis Choate, whose consistently brilliant game has brought her countless titles and belies her 59 years of age said, "To be able to make the match as close as it was gave me a big thrill." Mrs. Choate started winning the Apawamis Ladies Golf Championship back in 1935 and has captured the trophy twenty times. She was the U.S.G.A. Senior Champion in 1963 and has held the U.S. Women's Senior crown in 4 out of the last 5 years. The long-time Apawamis golfing great not only encouraged the young Kansas stylist to join Apawamis but was also instrumental in getting another lady golfer of superior caliber to become a member-Barbara Bruning McGhie, a former New York State Champion and holder of many other titles. Both these talented shotmakers wrested the Aawamis crown from Mrs. Choate causing her to remark philosophically, "Even though these young golfing 'wiz-kids' bring me down in flames, it's marvelous to have such top-flight women golfers at Apawamis with Barbara still here, too."

Jean Crawford's husband, a lefthanded former intercollegiate tennis doubles champion himself, said, "I guess I'll have to take up golf but the trouble is I can't decide whether to play the game lefthanded or right-handed. Either way it will be tough to beat Jean."
