Food Preference Poll Taken At Hospital

A poll of food preferences taken by United Hospital's dietary department among patients, personnel, students and members of the community indicates that most persons prefer a light meal at noon consisting of salads, sandwiches, hamburgers or other standard items, and a heavy meal in the evening with substantial menus such as steak, potato, vegetables and dessert.

In announcing the results of the community-wide poll, returned by more than 1,000 persons, Dietary Director Thomas Lind states that new hospital menus are being issued based on the survey and that patients will have a choice of either "light" or "substantial" meals for lunch and dinner. New menus are already in use in the pediatrics department.

The survey also revealed that ethnic foods are among the favorites and those least liked are liver, greasy foods and "gassy" vegetables.

Mr. Lind's report recommends a three-language guide issued to patients to facilitate food selection for non-English-speaking patients.
