Father Gallagher will speak on the work of the Paulist Fathers, the first body of Catholic priests to be founded in the United States. He directs the department of the Paulist Fathers concerned with research and development in religious education and mission.

He is a visiting lecturer at several Roman Catholic seminaries and has written materials and articles in the field of adult catechetics. He is a staff member of the Catholic Bishops' Commission for Ecumenical Affairs and a member of the Consultation on Prayer for Unity.

A native New Yorker and World War II veteran, Father Gallagher was a practising lawyer before being ordained to the priesthood.


