## Human Rights Unit Raises \$1400 For Scholarship Aid

More than \$1400 was earned from the recent production of Jerico-Jim Crow, sponsored by the Rye Council for Human Rights, it was announced by co-chairman Gordon Webber. The off-Broadway play, performed at the Rye high school last month, attracted almost nine hundred patrons, he told a Council meeting at his home on Kirby Lane North.

The money will be allocated for scholarship aid to Negro students in Rye who need help in going to college, he said. To this end, an application form will be drawn up and made available to interested students, with the understanding that students already attending college would be eligible to apply, if they need financial help to stay in school. Mr. Webber emphasized that the money would be given as an outright grant, and not a loan. Recommendations for recipients

will be made by the chairman of the Scholarship and Guidance Committee, Joseph Chira, at the next meeting, he said.

Other business transacted at the meeting included a report on the survey now being conducted by the Mayor's Commission on Human Relations to determine how many jobs are available in Rye for Negroes, what kinds of jobs they are, and how many people live outside of the city but work here. It is hoped that the Council will be able to use this information to assist Negroes living here to get jobs.

It was announced also that a Legal Committee had been set up to assist persons of minority groups to receive proper legal assistance when needed. Mrs. Joseph L. Paradise will head this committee, Mr. Webber stated.

He also announced the resignation of co-chairman Max Berking, who has become a candidate for State Senate. Robert Bendick of Grace Church Street has agreed to serve out the unexpired term as co-chairman of the Council.
