The attending staff of the United Hospital has become increasingly concerned over the fact that patients are now being subjected to too many visitors and too long visits. The doctors are unanimous in their opinion that this condition is retarding the patient's progress.

It is apparent that there has misunderstanding of the beralizing of the visiting which should not be interpreted as meaning that the patients can have more visitors and longer visits for, actually the change was made for the sole purpose of reducing the number of visitors at any one time. While this has been accomplished, the evils of the multiple visitors and lengthy visits still persist.

Doctors know, from experience, that patients are usually tired by too much company and that, freare entirely unaware of this seem to enjoy them, only to feel tired and depressed after the visits are over.

Certain basic principles have Brunton Radio Manager Rye Marine Lieutenants been found to be sound, and are the basis of visiting rules in all hospitals, the length and breadth of the land. They are:

First: During the early days of any illness, and during or soon after an operation or child-birth (that is, until the patient is well on the road to recovery) visiting should be limited to the immediate family.

Second: No more than two visitors should ever be in the patient's room at one time; and

Finally: Except for special reasons, visits should be brief - a cheery word or two; a visit to keep the patient aware that everyone is behind him and doing everything needful for his recovery; a few words to assure him that all is well at home with the children and the dog - these are visits that will help the patient and will keep the Hospital the quiet, restful place it should be.
