

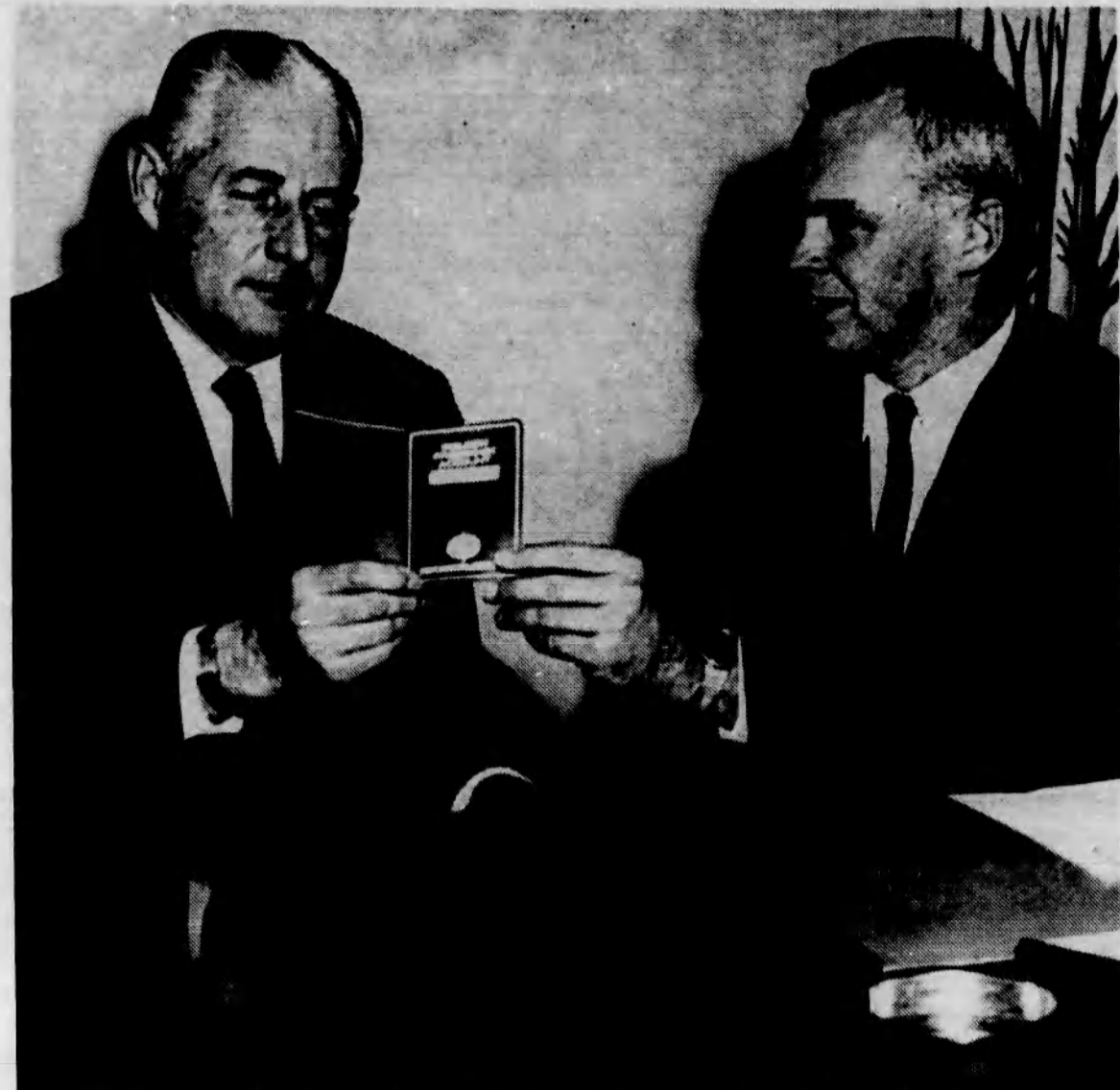
Lombardi Retiring From Activities In City And County

In an announcement to the press today, Remo M. Lombardi, of Rye Fuel & Supply Co. and its affiliated fuel and heating engineering concerns announced his resignation from the active management of the company and elevation of his son-in-law, Wilbur W. Couch to the top management position in the company. Mr. Lombardi will continue as advisor and consultant to the companies.

Simultaneously, Mr. Lombardi, who has long been active in City of Rye and Westchester County affairs, announced his resignation from the executive committee of the Westchester County Grand Jurors Association, the board of governors of Westchester Allied Trades Association. As vice-chairman of the Board of Advisors of the Rye Golf Course and as vice-president of the Rye Scholarship Foundation.

"In making these decisions, Mr. Lombardi said, I have always been of the opinion that in this changing and fast moving world in which we live there is always need for new viewpoints and new initiative in any business or civic endeavor if progress is to be maintained. Since first coming to Westchester now nearly half a century ago I have tried to take an active and helpful part in the affairs of the community. In leaving these positions of trust that I have held for many years I do so in the hope that my place will be taken by younger men with fresh viewpoints and fresh enthusiasm for the welfare and proper development of our city and county."

Mr. Lombardi served on the advisory committee to the first Planning Commission of Rye and was first chairman of the Human Relations Commission of the city. He was a member of the organizing committees which founded the Rye Fish and Game Club and the Rye Teen Age Canteen. He served on the board of the old Rye Trust Com-

in Florida and of the Rye Golf Course.

As President of the Penthouse Development Corporation of Florida Mr. Lombardi is presently engaged with Joseph Novotny of Rye in building a luxury apartment complex along the intercoastal waterway in Deerfield Beach, Florida, and will also continue as a consultant to Rye Fuel & Supply Co.
