1st Annual Meeting of Association For The Handicapped Held Here

The First Annual Meeting of the Association for the Handicapped of Rye was held recently in the Council Chamber of Rye's new City Hall.

Dr. E. J. Lorenze, Medical Director of the Burke Rehabilitation Center was the guest speaker. He discussed some of the major problems in the fast expanding field of rehabilitation medicine. In the four general areas of medicine, namely preventive, diagnostic, specific treatment, and rehabilitation, the third area of specific treatment has done a tremendous job in saving lives. But in some cases they have necessarily left a residual disability that requires rehabilitation, which accounts in part for the rapid expansion of the field. He pointed out the great need for active associations like the one in Rye to help handle the growing problems.

Preceding the Doctor's talk, Mrs. Baldwin Blanke presented to the meeting the new slate of officers who were elected unanimously. They are G. Marshall Houx, president; Mrs. Helen Donovan, vice-president; Miss Elizabeth Pollard,

OXFORD, O. — Marvin Pierce, a 1916 graduate of Miami University, was presented the "M-Man of the Year" award during halftime ceremonies of the Miami-Bowling Green football game Saturday.

A three-sport standout at Miami, Mr. Pierce was the recipient of the first annual award to be given to a former letter winner. He was captain of the 1915 football team, a pitcher in baseball and center on the basketball team.

While at Miami Mr. Pierce was a member of Beta Theta Pi Fraternity and Phi Beta Kappa honor society. He was graduated summa cum laude. Miami conferred an honorary degree Doctor of Laws upon

him in 1950. He also has an engineering degree from M.I.T.

Five years after graduation, Mr. Pierce joined McCall Corporation and became president and chairman of the board in 1946. After leaving McCall in 1959, he became a consultant for Time-Life and later, Look.

Since February of 1966, Mr. Pierce has been a member of the New York staff of the International Executive Service Corps—the so-called businessman's peace corps, which sends retired American executives to the developing countries as a volunteer business adviser.
