**Rye Concert Association To Hear Strauss Ensemble Of Vienna Symphony**

The Rye Community Concert Association will sponsor the first U.S. appearance of the Johann Strauss Ensemble of the Vienna Symphony Orchestra on February 7 at the High School. A three o'clock curtain is scheduled for this Sunday matinee concert.

Founded in 1965, the Johann Strauss Ensemble of the Vienna Symphony Orchestra, twelve in number including the director, was established to simulate the kind of orchestra with which Johann Strauss, Jr. was associated. The purpose of the six string and six wind and brass instrumentalists was to interpret the immortal music of the Straus family, in its original form (since the Strauss family did not perform with the large orchestras as we know them today). The ensemble also interprets the classical dances of Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven and Schubert, and in their first United States tour they will also perform special versions of waltzes and polkas which have never before been performed, and will be, for the first time, in the United States.

Traditionally, the first violinist of the ensemble is also the director and Professor Walter Puschacher, the current director, is an obvious choice for the position, since he is also the concertmaster of the Vienna Symphony Orchestra, with a great love of old Viennese music.

The Johann Strauss Ensemble has toured throughout Germany, France, Czechoslovakia, and South Africa.
